

## THE TRESTLE BRIDGE

The dramatic wooden trestle bridge over the Credit River on the Forks of the Credit Road is a genuine treat to see. But at 1,100 feet long and 85 feet high, it is also a real danger. The railroad is active and is used by unscheduled trains at almost any time of the day. Please respect the potential danger and stay off the bridge.

## FORKS OF THE CREDIT ROAD

The Forks of the Credit Road is not only a scenic drive, it is also a residential road with small cul-de-sac tributaries. Please respect the needs of Caledon residents to keep the road open for guests, deliveries, emergency vehicles, etc. Some roads will be barricaded and blocked to visiting traffic. There are many interesting views along the through roads, and the Town appreciates your respect for these blockades.

## PARKING

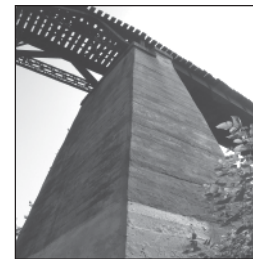
For those visiting the village of Belfountain, parking is available at the Belfountain Conservation Area (please see map for details). It is an enjoyable walk from this area to the nearby shops and restaurants. Limited parking is available within the village.

Additional parking is available at the Forks of the Credit Provincial Park located on McLaren Road, south of Charleston sideroad.

A few parking spaces exist beside the Credit River if you wish to fish or picnic.

## WASHROOM FACILITIES

Portable washroom facilities have been placed for the convenience of visitors. There are permanent facilities available in nearby villages. Handicapped accessible units will be located in Belfountain and at the north end of Mississauga Road.
