## **DEADLINE FOR ORDERS EXTENDED! NATIVE TREE SEEDLING PROGRAM PROMOTES REFORESTATION IN COMMUNITY**

It's not too late to order seedlings!

In association with the Halton Peel Woodlands and Wildlife Stewardship, the Town of Caledon's native tree seedling program promotes and encourages private reforestation efforts by making affordable native nursery stock accessible to local residents.

Native stock available to order this year is from local tree seed zone 34 and includes coniferous seedling transplants (White Pine, White Spruce, White Cedar and Eastern Hemlock), deciduous saplings (Sugar Maple, Silver Maple, Bur Oak, and Black Cherry) and deciduous shrubs (Nannyberry and Highbush Cranberry). To participate in the program a **minimum order of 10 conifer seedlings and/or 5 deciduous trees or shrubs is required**. Applications that do not meet these requirements will not be accepted.

Pick-up is Saturday, April 30, 2011 at the Albion Bolton Community Centre, 150 Queen Street South, Bolton from 8:00am to 12:00pm.

Application forms have been mailed to Caledon residents but are also available to download from the Town's website at [www.caledon.ca](http://www.caledon.ca) or can be picked up at Town Hall, 6311 Old Church Road, in Caledon East.
